

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter presents: (1) conclusion, (2) suggestions.

5.1 Conclusions

Based on the findings and interpretation in the previous chapter, it could be conclude as follows: First, from the result of pretest to posttest in teaching descriptive writing by using guided writing strategy, significant difference on students' descriptive writing achievement of the tenth grade students of SMA Muhammadiyah 6 Palembang was found. Second, it was found that there was significant difference students' descriptive writing achievement in poor, average, good, and excellent categories by using guided writing strategy and those who were not at SMA Muhammadiyah 6 Palembang.

From the result of the research finding, I concluded that learning descriptive text by using guided writing was effective to increase the student's score in descriptive writing. It can seen from the mean score of posttest. The mean score of posttest in experimental class which was taught by guided writing was higher than the mean of control class which doesn't not use guided writing.

5.2. Suggestions

Based on the conclusions, some suggestions can be dedicated to the teachers, students and other researcher. The first, to make writing easier for the teachers, the teachers should be more creative in finding and using new strategies that can improve and develop the students' ability in descriptive writing.

The second, the students should understand that English is very important, especially in this global era. So, the students should learn English seriously. The students should think that learning English especially writing is not boring and difficult as they think. And the students should be more active and enlarge the vocabularies and understand about the grammatical in English because it is helpful to write a good descriptive paragraph.

The last is for the other reseacher. Finally, since there might be other factos influence in teaching achievement, it is suggested that other researchers explore those factors. Since this study was conducted in limited time and limited population, it is also sugessted that a further study can be conducted in the wider opulation and longer times.
