## ABSTRACT

"Review of Sharia Economic Law on the Practice of "Lanyah or Rojo" Harvest Rental on Rice Farming Land in Sindang Sari Village, Lempuing District, Ogan Ilir Regency", The background of the problem is the distribution of harvest results which sometimes harms one of the parties renting agricultural land by dividing it not in accordance with the initial agreement. This research is a type of field research by visiting the research site directly, the type of data used is qualitative. The data sources used are primary data obtained through observation, interviews and documentation. And secondary data is obtained through a literature review such as books, previous research, literature, and journals related to the research. The data collection techniques used are by conducting observations, interviews and documentation. Then the data that has been collected is analyzed descriptively qualitatively and then summarized inductively. The results of the study on the lease of rice farming land in Sindan Sari Village The practice of renting rice farming land between landowners and tenants in Sindang Sari Village, Lempuing District, Ogan Komering Ilir Regency is called Ijarah Using a Contract system between the person renting (Mu'jir) and the tenant (Musta'jir). The agreement made is in accordance with local customs, namely by using the lanyah or rojo system, namely a rental system based on the season for one year, namely (lanyah or rojo) is the first harvest season, (gadu) is the second harvest season and the third is (ngonyol) farmers are rarely interested when entering this third season because almost 85% of harvests fail due to poor land, low rainfall resulting in drought and so on. The review of Sharia Economic Law on the lease of rice farming land in Sindang Sari Village, Lempuing District, Ogan Komering Ilir Regency is not in accordance with Sharia Economic Law. Because if the harvest is not in accordance with the division of the lessee will be very little and there will be an element of loss if there is a crop failure.
